

BIZ LEADERS RAISE \$240,000 FOR DEVELOPMENT SCHOOL FOR YOUTH

200 New York business leaders raised \$240,000 at the fourth annual “Learning from Leaders” charity luncheon held this past Wednesday, Nov. 16. The event was a benefit for the Joseph A. Forgione Development School for Youth (DSY), one of the country’s foremost leadership development programs for urban youth.

The luncheon honored James M. Malkin, Chairman and CEO of SourceMedia, a leading media organization covering the financial services industry and JP Morgan Chase. Over the last five years, Chase and Chase employees have generously supported the DSY – individually and on a corporate level. To date, the bank has also provided summer internships for 30 DSY students and over the last eight years, more than one hundred New York corporations and financial institutions have invested in minority youth development by providing workshops, summer internships and financial support for the DSY.

The DSY is a program of the non-profit All Stars Project (www.allstars.org), founded in 1981 by Drs. Lenora Fulani and Fred Newman.
